On Guam, U.S. Marines used a team of 60 canines, known as "devil dogs." They were primarily Doberman pinschers and German shepherds, and a few mongrels.

Pvt. 1st Class Butch visits the graves of his buddies, Kurt and Skipper. Skipper was mortally wounded during a Japanese banzai attack.
